We are overjoyed to share with you yet another milestone achievement from Haven of Hope Academy, Nigeria.



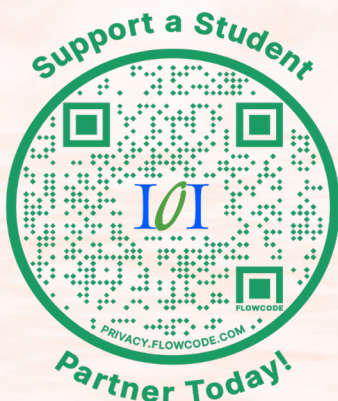

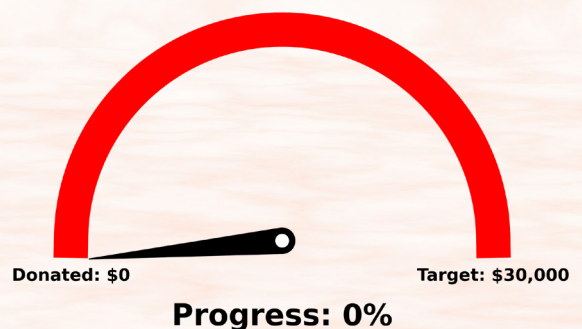

School Construction Update

Haven of Hope Academy

Dear Prayer Partners,

We are excited to share with you the latest update on the Haven of Hope Academy (HHA) school construction.

In our last update of the school construction, we reported that the construction team are working on plumbing, electrical installations, internal and external plastering, fixing of doors and windows, after which they will proceed to tiling, networking and painting. We are glad to report that there has been significant progress on the work. The internal plastering is 100% completed. External Plastering is 95% completed! The remaining 5% is tied to the completion of the ramp which is currently at 45% alongside work on the building facade.



Handrails and balustrades are 95% done. These safety features are essential as we prepare for full usage across floors. Tiling is 95% completed. Electrification, wiring, lighting, and fittings are 98% done. Ceiling fans have been installed in 5 of the 14 classrooms. Piping and wiring are in place; mounting of switches, CCTV cameras, and racks will follow soon. Provisional painting is 100% done on the first floor to allow students to use it for classes while work is ongoing on other floors. Temporary furniture has been moved onto this floor, and students are now actively using the space.

Classes are currently ongoing. With the completion of the first floor, the school was able to admit more students, to accommodate the number of students who sat for the entrance exams, which the old school building was not able to accommodate because of space constraint. We thank God for the progress made on the school building construction. We are grateful for God's continuous provision for His work. And we hope to get everything done soon.



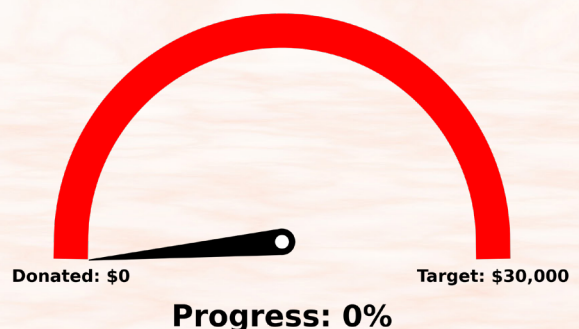

We are excited to share with you a few testimonies from the correctors of the Emmaus Bible courses for the Haven of Hope Academy - HHA



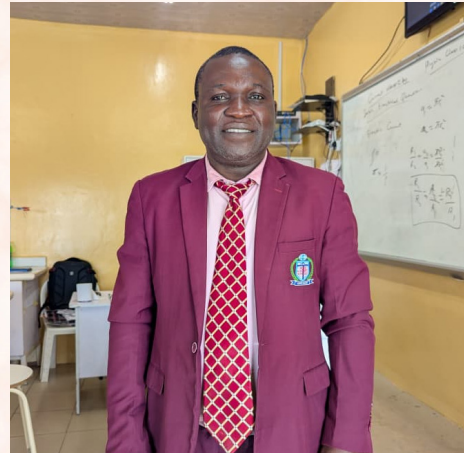

It's a valuable resource that blesses both facilitators and students alike.

I have spent about six years here, and the Emmaus Bible Course has had a profound impact on me, especially in helping people first come to know the Lord.

Having had a similar experience while in secondary school, I was fortunate to participate in World Bible School through correspondence and other online platforms. Preaching the Word of God

We are thrilled to share with you the recently concluded Mission Exposure to Nigeria.

On October 12th, Raymond (from the USA) and Fred Konadu (our coordinator from Ghana) joined the media team in Nigeria for the Mission Exposure. We traveled to five cities: Port Harcourt, Enugu, Lagos, Jos, and Abuja, where we shared the Gospel, encouraged believers, and witnessed firsthand what God has done through the Emmaus Bible Courses. One of the highlights was celebrating graduations at various Bible Centres. In total, 373 students graduated - men and women who have diligently studied the Bible through these courses. Many of them testified to the transformation they've experienced through the Word of God.



After the graduation in Lagos, we visited the Haven of Hope in Jos, spent time with the dedicated staff, encouraged them, and rejoiced in the work God accomplished through their hands. Next, we traveled to Abuja for the final graduation, where Raymond also had the privilege of preaching during a Sunday service. In addition, we held a wheelchair distribution in Enugu (Southeast Nigeria) and a medical outreach in Lagos. Although there were areas we couldn't reach due to security challenges, we are deeply grateful for God's protection and faithfulness throughout the journey. To Him alone be all the glory!

Dear Prayer Partners,

We are excited to bring you an update on what God is doing through Hope Haven Hospital in Nigeria.

October 29th is globally recognized as World Stroke Day. This is a day dedicated to raising awareness about the dangers of stroke, the importance of early prevention, and the need for effective treatment and care for survivors.



In response to this global call, Hope Haven Hospital, in collaboration with two organizations: **Hovid** and **Mega Lifescience Pharmaceuticals**, organized a free medical outreach with the theme “**Act Fast**” to serve the community, existing patients and the residents of Jos. The goal was to provide screening, testing, treatment, and education to help reduce the burden of stroke and related health conditions.



The outreach took place at the Hope Haven Hospital, and was open to the entire community. People came not only from Kwang (where Haven of Hope resides) but from across the city of Jos to benefit from the services provided. Attendees received the following:

- Free screening for stroke risk factors, including high blood pressure and diabetes
- Free Fasting Blood Glucose (FBG) tests
- Free medications, based on medical indication
- A presentation on the causes, recognition, types, prevention, and treatment of stroke

Beyond the physical care, we saw God touch lives in meaningful ways. For many of the attendees, this was their first time receiving professional medical attention and education about stroke and related cases. Several were identified as high-risk and are now being followed up with ongoing care. All were grateful that someone cared enough to reach out. From our daily medical services to periodic free outreach programs, we are committed to bringing Christ-centered, quality healthcare to those who need it most.

We are excited to share with you an update from the THADDEUS Scholarship at Haven of Hope Academy (HHA)

For several years now, the THADDEUS Scholarship has opened doors of opportunity for children who are orphans, those affected by civil unrest, and bright students from financially disadvantaged homes. Through this scholarship, many students have not only accessed quality education at HHA but have also gone on to further their studies in higher institutions across the country.



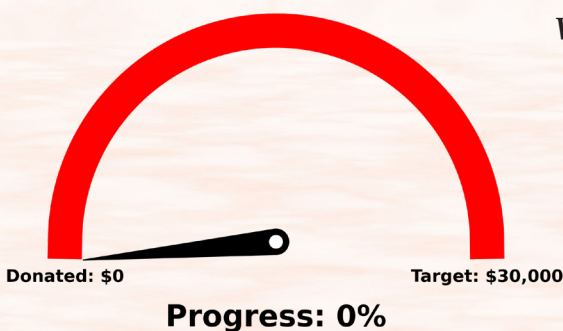
As we began a new academic session this September, a few more students were welcomed into the program. We are excited to report that fifteen (15) students are now benefitting from this scholarship. One person from the middle school, and fourteen from the high school (from grade 7 to grade 12). The THADDEUS scholarship program has been a lifeline for many families, enabling students to access quality Christian education regardless of their financial background.

It covers tuition, school uniforms, books and stationery, and registration for both local and international exams. Some of these students have been part of the program since middle school. It's been a joy to watch them grow and thrive.

We are prayerfully looking to expand the reach of the scholarship subsequently, to include more children in dire need of support. The cost of sponsoring one student is \$100 USD per month. But beyond the financial aid, the THADDEUS scholarship is an investment in the future; to build, train, and raise a generation of leaders shaped by academic excellence and grounded in Christ-centered values. We hold firmly to God's Word in Galatians 6:10: **"So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith."**

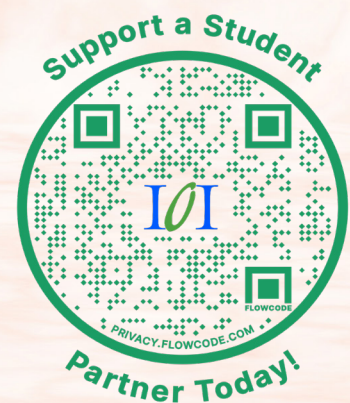

A NATION AT THE CROSSROADS

Nigeria stands today as the epicenter of one of the world's greatest spiritual and humanitarian crises.

Despite its population, influence, and economic potential, Nigeria has become one of the most terror-stricken countries in the world. According to the 2025 Global Terrorism Index, Nigeria remains among the world's top hotspots of violent extremism. Terror groups such as Boko Haram and the Islamic State West Africa Province (ISWAP) continue to unleash devastating attacks—bombings, kidnappings, targeted assassinations, mass killings, etc.



While some regions of the world have seen significant declines in terrorism, the Sahel region, which includes northern Nigeria, has experienced the opposite: a sharp increase in extremist activity. This concentration of terror highlights the enormous challenges countries like Nigeria face in combating ideologies that thrive on instability, poverty, corruption, and religious intolerance.

One indicator of this growing insecurity is the kidnapping epidemic. According to Nigeria's National Bureau of Statistics, **families paid N2.23 trillion (\$1.536 billion USD) in ransom between May 2023 and April 2024.** Kidnapping has become a terror to the nation's economy, one that grips families, communities, and institutions with fear.

One heartbreaking example occurred in August 2024, when twenty christian medical students from the University of Jos were abducted while traveling to Enugu (a state in the Southeastern part of Nigeria) for a conference. Their captors demanded millions of naira, plunging their families and institutions into fear and uncertainty. Though they were eventually released, their ordeal mirrors thousands of similar stories unfolding across the nation.

THE COST OF BEING A CHRISTIAN IN NIGERIA

Nigeria is widely recognized as one of the most dangerous places on earth to be a Christian. The numbers alone are staggering. According to Open Doors research, more Christians are killed for their faith in Nigeria than in the rest of the world combined. More than 16.2 million Christians in sub-Saharan Africa, including high numbers from Nigeria, have been driven from their homes by violence and conflict. Millions now live in displacement camps.

The perpetrators of this violence include Boko Haram, ISWAP, and extremist Fulani militias who see Christian communities as enemies. Their attacks include:

- Burning churches
- Massacring Christian villages
- Destroying farmland and food sources
- Targeted assassinations of pastors and leaders
- Kidnapping believers during services
- Forcing entire communities into displacement

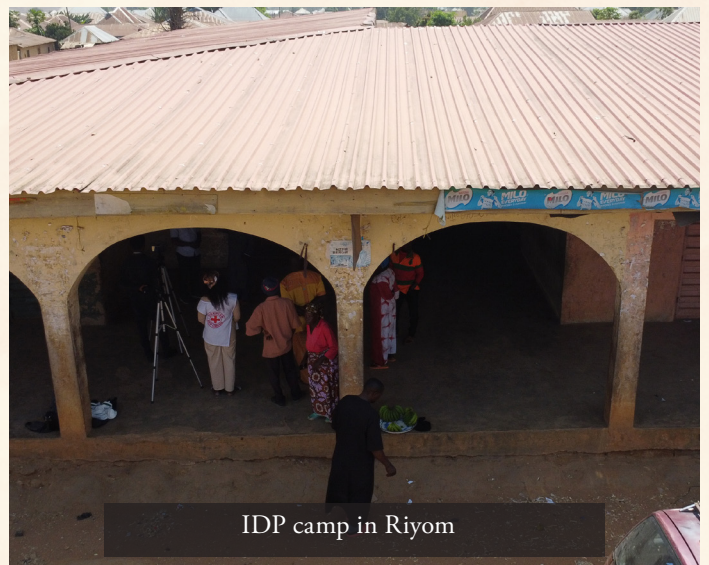
And while the world's attention has often been on northern and middle belt regions of Nigeria, Christian persecution has now spread to the Southeastern and Southwestern regions where some entire Christian communities have been wiped out or displaced. Survivors describe the violence as more organized, more targeted, and more relentless than ever before.

This level of violence against the Christian faith is unparalleled globally, making Nigeria a critical focus for the international Christian community.

Terrorism in Nigeria cannot be separated from the persecution of Christians. These extremist groups operate with a deliberate Islamic agenda: to uproot Christian presence, impose radical religious laws, and control territories through fear.

Their strategies include:

- Systematic displacement of Christian populations
- Destruction of key institutions such as churches and schools
- Kidnappings intended to terrorise and silence the Church

As a result, millions of Christians have been forced from their homes, creating one of Africa's largest internal displacement crises. Families who once lived peacefully now survive in makeshift camps, relying on churches and NGOs for food, shelter, and emotional healing.

Terror and persecution: two sides of the same strategy

The intertwining of terrorism and persecution has produced a cycle of suffering, eroding Nigeria's stability and threatening the social fabric of communities that have coexisted for generations.

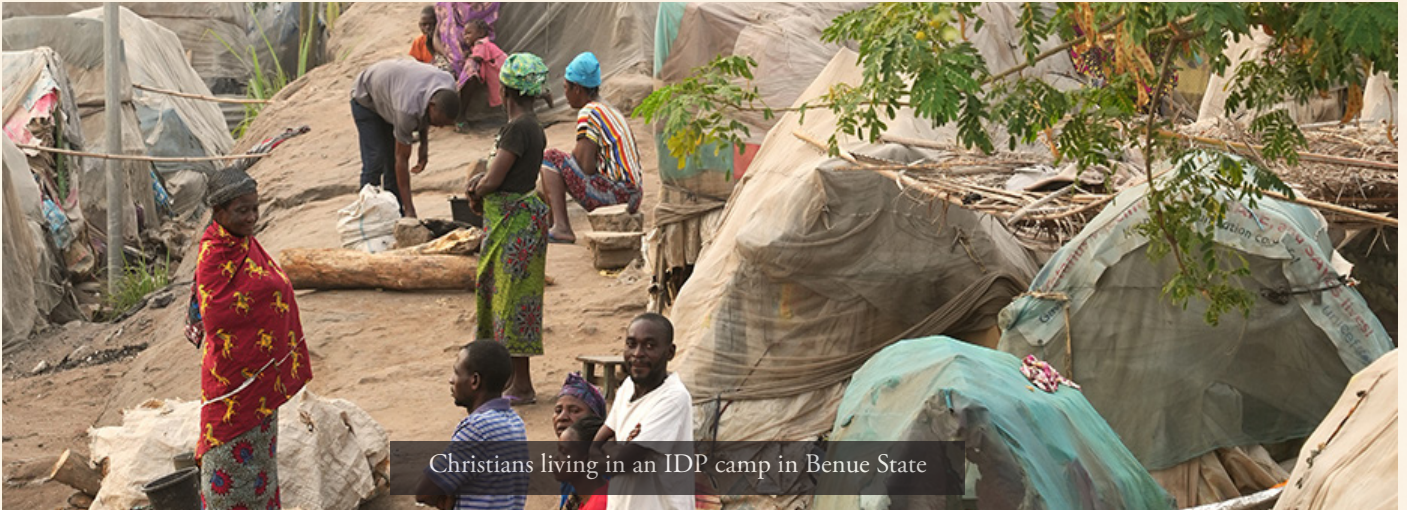

A report by the International Society for Civil Liberties and Rule of Law (Intersociety) reveals that 7,087 Christians were massacred in the first 220 days of 2025—an average of 32 believers killed every day.

For years, the Nigerian government has downplayed the scale of the violence, framing it as a “herders-farmers clash” but survivors, communities, and unbiased research tell a different story—one of coordinated, systematic extermination. The government have continued to downplay the pain and suffering of the people. They have denied the obvious because of their political interest. This shows that the problems the nation is facing regarding security is nothing but a gross failure in leadership. Political leaders are so callous, trading the wellbeing of the citizens for their personal interest.

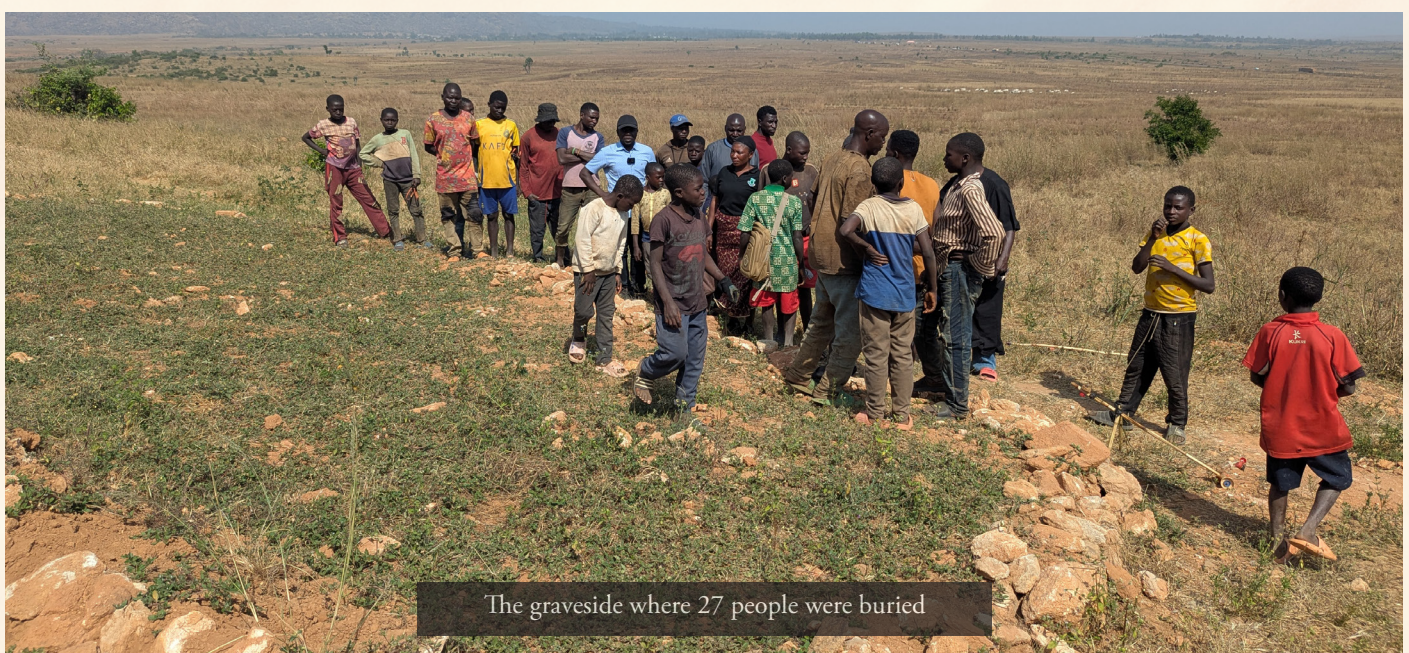
Recently, our media team visited two communities in Riyom Local Government Area near Jos. They met victims who had been displaced from their homes for some time. A few months ago, there were over 200 victims who were struggling to survive in an overcrowded, unsuitable community hall in one of the villages, because they had been chased from their villages. One of the widows narrated how her husband was killed, and they now live in this new community. Other persons shared stories of losing spouses, children, homes, and entire life histories. Many are traumatized, carrying both physical and emotional wounds.

THE BINDI MASSACRE

July 15, 2025 – A night of horror

On that night, Fulani militants stormed the Christian community of Bindi at around 3:00 a.m. By dawn: 27 people lay dead - 13 children, 9 women and 5 men. The militants burned houses, including the pastor's home, where nine people were killed, among them a one-month-old baby. The attackers mutilated the baby's body in an act too evil to fully comprehend. We walked with the community to the mass gravesite, the silence there speaking louder than words. The community received threats from their attackers of possible reinvasion of the community. To survive the ongoing threats, the community now sends their women away every evening—returning only when daylight brings temporary safety.

This is only one community in one region. There are thousands more across Nigeria living the same nightmare.



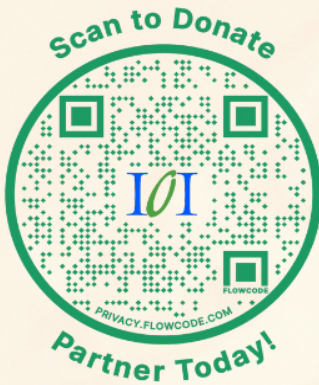
THE STATE OF THE NATION

As the security situation worsens all over the country, especially the abduction of school children, some states have instructed all elementary, middle and high schools to shut down until the situation is looked into. Currently, the Haven of Hope Academy, Jos, which is one of the projects of IOI has also vacated.

HOW CAN WE HELP?

Nigeria remains one of our major mission fields. We ask that you continue to:

- **Pray for Nigeria:** pray for protection, healing, restoration, and strength
- **Pray for the Church:** pray for believers who remain on the frontlines of persecution
- **Support the Victims:** food, shelter, medical aid, trauma counseling, and rebuilding efforts are urgently needed

We are excited to share with you a few testimonies from ex-prisoners who have studied the Emmaus Bible courses.



Ciroma Ayuba Kolo
(Completed 12 courses)

I am Ciroma Ayuba Kolo. The Emmaus Bible Courses really impacted my life. My journey with Emmaus began when I was convicted and imprisoned. I was an officer in the Nigerian Air Force and was convicted for speaking at a Christian youth event without official military permission.

My intention at that event was simply to address critical issues affecting young people, such as drug abuse and insecurity, and that led to my two-year imprisonment in Jos Correctional Center.

But as the Scripture says, '**All things work together for good to those who love God.**' It was during that time in prison that I enrolled in the Emmaus courses. To God's glory, my time there was not wasted. Through Emmaus courses, God transformed me and also gave me the opportunity to be a blessing to others. I was able to counsel and encourage many fellow inmates.

Not all those in prison are criminals. Many, like myself, are victims of circumstance. That's why we must continue to pray for them and reach out, just as Emmaus reached out to me and many others.



James Tumba
(Completed 12 courses)

My name is James Tumba, and I'm from Adamawa State. I served as an army officer until a false accusation led to my imprisonment.

By the grace of God, I've completed the first Bible series (12 courses). My experience is similar to that of someone who has attended a conventional university. The course was greatly educational and interactive, and I learned a lot from it. I learned practical theology. I especially appreciated the course on Personal Evangelism.

Getting to the prison, I learned about the Emmaus course. *Personal Evangelism* was very interesting. I passed it well. Through this course, I played the role of a secret disciple. I also discipled other prisoners.

When I first entered prison, I was consumed with thoughts of revenge, but through the Emmaus courses and the guidance of Pastor Jonathan Aboi, God changed me. My wife has already started testifying about what Emmaus has done for me.

I'm so happy and grateful!

A Testimony of Hope

Beyond Suffering

We are thrilled to share with you a testimony of what God is doing as a result of the **Beyond Suffering** training by **Joni and Friends**, held during our annual leadership conference in Jos this past April.



The training was deeply impactful. Attendees were challenged to return to their churches, communities, and families and make a difference in the lives of those living with disabilities - people often overlooked or marginalized in society. We are excited to report that some participants took that challenge to heart and are already making a visible difference. One such inspiring story comes from Dr. Folayinmi Ruth Olasumbo, a medical doctor from Lagos, who shares her journey:

“During the Emmaus Conference this year in Jos, we were trained by Joni and Friends on disability inclusion and the importance of caring for those often neglected. The session deeply moved me, and I made a personal commitment to act when I returned home.

I began with widows in my community, many of whom live with disability or health issues such as partial stroke or high blood pressure. I brought them together under a canopy at an event center, and we spent time together encouraging them. We reminded them that disability is not the end of the road, that there is still hope and purpose. We shared food, medication, and more importantly, friendship. Alongside the widows, we also have the visually impaired individuals and provided care and support, sharing with them that they are seen, loved, and not forgotten. The atmosphere was filled with joy and gratitude. Many testified that their spirits had been lifted and their hope renewed.”

This is just one example of how the Beyond Suffering message is taking root and bearing fruit in local communities across Nigeria. We urge you to continue to pray:

- That more leaders will rise to meet this challenge in their own communities
- That people living with disabilities will experience the love and hope of Christ
- That the church in Nigeria will increasingly become a place of inclusion and healing



Dear Prayer Partners,

We are thrilled to share with you the wonderful things God is doing in **Ghana!**

In our last Harvest Highlights, we mentioned plans to extend the water project to some of the most vulnerable communities in the Bono Region. Many of these communities have long struggled with water scarcity, walking long distances to fetch unsafe water from streams and ponds for drinking, cooking, and daily use. The toll on their health and daily living has been significant. Today, we are overjoyed to report that two new water wells have been successfully drilled, one in Krukrom and the other in Issakrom, both located in Sunyani, the capital of the Bono Region. These wells will now provide hundreds of people with safe, and accessible water.



The Issakrom borehole has been fully mechanized with solar panels, since the community has no access to electricity. This solar-powered system ensures a sustainable and eco-friendly water supply for the entire village. The Krukrom borehole is not yet mechanized, but plans are already underway to complete that soon, making access to clean water even easier and more reliable. What a joy it is to see families experiencing a better quality of life! Even more importantly, these water projects are opening doors for the Gospel. As physical needs are met, hearts are opening to the message of Christ, the One who offers living water to all who believe.



While the work is far from over, we rejoice in the impact this is already making in the lives of individuals, families, and communities. We thank God for His faithfulness.

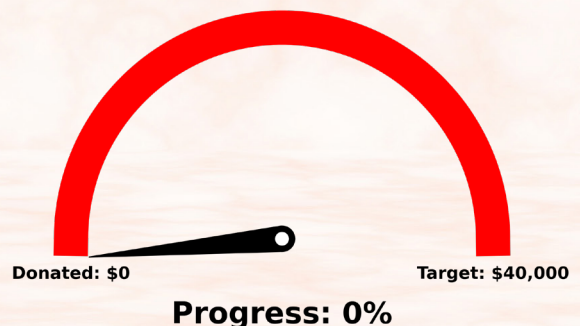

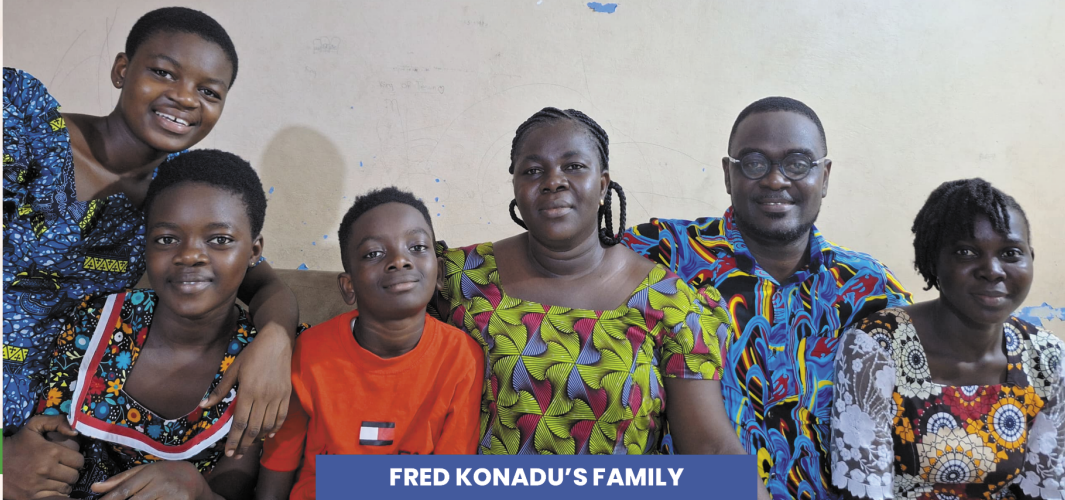

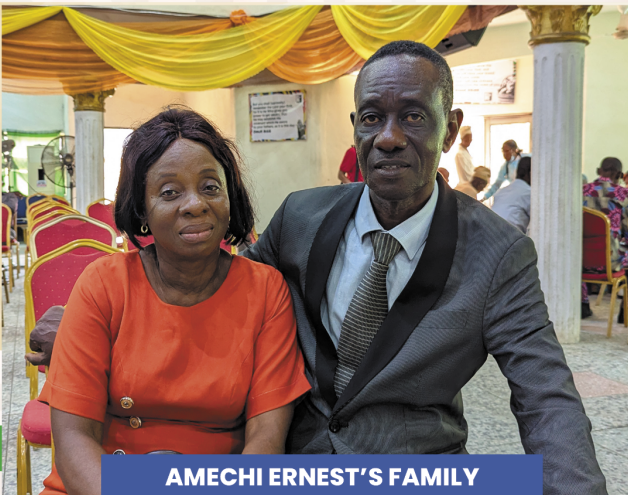
